

## Judge Beth Smith, Precinct 2, (D)

Judge Beth Smith was elected to her first term in office in 1999 to the Justice Court, Precinct 2. Pct. 2 includes, the City of Kyle, City of Mountain City, City of Umland, and dozens of subdivisions surrounding these cities. They include, but not limited to, Steeplechase, The Trails, Crosshouse Estates, Quail Meadows, Dove Hollow Estates, Meadowoods, Green Pastures, Creekside, 4 Seasons, Plum Creek, Spring Branch, and Silverado. Beth attended Austin Community College and Southwest Texas State University, studying Criminal Justice. She has attended over 280 continuing education hours as Justice of the Peace.

She was elected as the First Mayor of Mountain City at 28 yrs of age in 1984, and served in a voluntary capacity for 14 years. Judge Smith has lived in Mountain City for 29 years and continues to serve as the Coordinator and Host for National Night out annually. Her education, experience w/students, life skills, public relations experience and past position as the Campus Manager for Austin Community College has given her the appropriate demeanor, character, and decision making skills, with an emphasis on the juvenile aspect of Justice Court, to be an effective Justice of the Peace.

As the area that she serves explodes w/population, she continues to keep up with the technology and pace to lead a very efficient staff and office.

Judge Smith is known for working with her constituents in many capacities and has continued to honor her campaign promises of 1999: "to work with law enforcement, the school district, and most importantly, the citizens of precinct 2 toward a safer community". Judge Smith has formed a very strong alliance with numerous non-profit agencies that aid in not only serving justice, but getting to the root of occurrences with the youth in our community. Each juvenile that she sees for a class C misdemeanor is connected with an individual counselor for guidance. Her court hours have been adjusted so the students miss minimal school education if any at all. She is available 24/7 for guidance and referrals, although she is not allowed, by law, to give legal advice or discuss your case on an individual basis if there is a plea of “not guilty” or pending a plea.

She has been married to Everett for 30 years, who is the Director of Engineering and Maintenance with Texas-Lehigh. They have 3 children: Shane and his wife Lori, Tiffany and her husband John, (and she is so very proud of her grandson, Johnathan), and Crystal. They all reside in her precinct and are very supportive of her position in the community.
